
Reputation

Today, Rutgers is a premier public research institution with an outstanding reputation known throughout the world.






Faculty

Faculty by the Numbers

- 99% of faculty hold a Ph.D. or other terminal degree
- 14:1 student-to-faculty ratio
- 38 Rutgers faculty have achieved membership in the National Academy of Sciences, National Academy of Engineering, and Institute of Medicine
- 57 are elected fellows of the American Association for the Advancement of Science
- 22 are elected members of the Academy of Arts and Sciences

Research

- 60% of undergraduate students at Rutgers engage in original research.
- Rutgers has more than 300 research centers.
- Rutgers research has produced some amazing advancements including:
 - The discovery of Streptomycin (an antibiotic first discovered to fight tuberculosis)
 - Inventing the ceramic tile used in the heat shield of space shuttles
 - Successfully deploying the first unmanned underwater glider to cross the Atlantic Ocean


Academics

 - 6-year PharmD program



Highlights

- Honors Programs provide an intense and rigorous education founded on a strong core of study in the arts and sciences.
- For students interested in research, many programs offer the option of completing an honors thesis or senior honors thesis, which are entirely research focused.

Career Services

- Hands-on training and internships are a fundamental component of the Rutgers curriculum.

- Rutgers University has one of the largest and most comprehensive Career Services departments in the country.

New Jersey

- Our campuses in New Brunswick, Newark, and Camden are centrally located on the east coast of the United States.
- New York City and Philadelphia are nearby cities, and Boston and Washington D.C. are just a few hours away by train or by car.
- Major nearby international airports include JFK, Newark and Philadelphia.











New Brunswick

- Rutgers University-New Brunswick is Rutgers' flagship campus as designated by the AAU.
- 41,000 students call Rutgers-New Brunswick home and 16,000 students live on campus.
- New Brunswick is less than an hour by train from New York City and just over an hour from Philadelphia. The New Brunswick train station is located one block from campus.











Newark

- Newark, NJ is the home of Rutgers University-Newark and Rutgers Health Sciences-Newark.
- The urban location of the Newark Campus gives our 12,000 students access to hundreds of internships in New York City (just 20 minutes away by train).











Camden

- Rutgers University-Camden is located in the southern part of New Jersey.
- The Camden Campus offers an intimate campus setting for its 6,200 students.
- Philadelphia is located just across the Delaware River and provides students tremendous opportunities for internships and future employment.





- 52,000-seat football stadium






Dining
